

Two-thirds of voters say teachers in Connecticut are not paid enough






Three-quarters of voters favor the state of Connecticut providing more funding to cities and towns to support teacher salaries






90% of voters say teachers should be paid more than or comparable to professions with similar education and training requirements



Nearly three-quarters of voters believe teachers who worked during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic should receive hero pay or other compensation for that work


